



30+ Names That Mean Phoenix: A Unique, Meaningful and Touch of Magic N

The name Phoenix has ancient roots and symbolizes rebirth and renewal. There are many names from various cultures and languages that relate to the mystical firebird.

One name meaning "Phoenix" is Fawkes. This name comes from the Latin "phoenicius" meaning crimson or purple. Fawkes became more widely known from the Harry Potter series, as the name of Dumbledore's phoenix.

From Greek mythology, names like Phonikas or Phoinix directly reference the legendary bird. In Greek, "phoinix" means date palm or Phoenician/Red. Two feminine variants are Phaenicia and Phonissa.

In Persian, the name Simurgh refers to a benevolent, long-lived mythological bird similar to the phoenix. This name has been used internationally since ancient times.

From Japan, names like Homura or Honō reflect the fiery attributes of the phoenix. "Homura" means flame 掠, while "Honō" means blaze 🔥. These names work well for both males and females.

One Arabic name is Millicent, derived from "milsinn" or phoenix. In this tradition, the phoenix symbolizes humility, virtue and rebirth of the soul.

For those of Celtic or druid heritage, names like Fyrra or Eala pay homage to the mythical fiery birds said to have nested in Ireland and Scotland. "Fyrra" means flame 🌟 and "Eala" means swan-like.

Probably the most literal translation is the Vietnamese name Phượng, directly meaning phoenix 🐦. This also works as both a feminine and masculine name.

No matter the culture or language, names tied to the resilient phoenix convey strength, rebirth and eternal life. Their meanings provide inspiration through times of transition or hardship.
