

Tips for Wooden Furniture Care

- Following an honest clean, it is vital to form sure that you simply wax the wood to assist it retains its shine. Follow the instructions on the label and apply a skinny coating of wax to the wood, buffing lightly with a cloth. - Clean your furniture regularly. you'll either use a soft clean cloth on its own or apply a little amount of wax polish, Briwax spray wax for instance. don't clean with water. Water on a waxed surface will leave watermarks. Any watermarks/stains are often easily removed with a fresh coat of wax.
- If your furniture features a small scratch or ring marks (a common problem with hot cups, etc) you do not get to completely refinish the whole piece. There are some superb products available that will resolve these problems by using scratch covers, retouch crayons, or specialized ring removers. this is often the foremost cost-effective thanks to eradicating any issues and revive the wood. - Confirm to put the furniture correctly within the room. Wood that's placed in direct sunlight can find yourself fading, cracking, or drying out. If possible, locate your furniture far away from windows so it's not in direct sunlight. In most cases, window sills are made up of wood. It is vital to regularly polish and wax them to stop them from drying out. Also, attempt to place your wooden furniture far away from vents or heating units to avoid drying and cracking.
