It is attractive due to its beauty and transparency, yet it is still not beneficial in the long run as the elements in onyx stone are sensitive to acids and bases which will cause an oxidation process and essentially destroy at the worktop.


For these and other reasons, it is not a great choice for kitchen surfaces, however, it does create a stunning splashback and flooring.


Kitchen with Onyx Worktops aren't as Strong
