


Living room


Best Living Room Guide

- 1. Do not pick the paint colour for your walls first. A wide range of colour options for paint is readily available and painting is not much of a task.
- 2. Place your favourite or most valuable artefact in the living room and spruce up around it. AVOID displaying artworks too high. Artwork is frequently hung higher than it should be from the ceiling, which is a great mistake. Display it at a level comfortable for the eyes to see.
- 3. Invest in the highest-quality sofa set you can afford. You want your sofa to last, obviously, it is a pricey investment. A high-end sofa should last up to 25 years, while an average one should last at least 10.
- 4. Follow the fundamental guidelines for pattern-based decorating. In a single room, three is the best number to employ. Use one large, one medium, and one little to balance the scale.

- 5. Never use a rug that is too small for the room. The most common error in living room décor is this. Make sure that the entire furniture set sits on the rug. If it's not possible to fit all four legs, make it a point to at least fit the front legs. The legs of smaller pieces, however, should always be on them.
- 6. AVOID pushing every piece of furniture up against a wall.
- 7. Do not ignore the importance of dimmer switches. In fact, each and every light in a living room should have a dimmer switch on it.
- 8. A few more throw pillows are fine. Use only a few of them so you don't have to keep taking them off every time you try to sit.



Family Room vs Living Room



Traditionally, the living room was a more formal space than the family room. It functioned as the space where guests were received. The family room was only used by the family and occasionally by visitors during casual gatherings. Your living room may serve as a more formal or informal meeting space, depending on your particular preferences and style. 
Best Living Room Ideas that are Unique

Bohemian Theme






Blend Different Styles


Floor Seating




Living Room Lighting
