

Lakers, San Antonio, Paul on Potential Destinations



The future of the veteran point guard is drawing attention.

According to reporter Mark Stein of The Stein Line, the hanging battery of Golden State Warriors' 'CP3' Chris Paul (Guard, 183 cm, 79 kg) is being discussed.

Reporter Stein also mentioned the possibility of Paul going to San Antonio at the end of April. This time, in addition to San Antonio, the Lakers were added.

This is a natural step. It is highly likely that Golden State will not guarantee Paul's upcoming 2024-2025 season salary, as he is expected to earn a whopping \$30 million next season. However, if he is let go at the end of June due to unwarranted conditions, his contract could be terminated. If he comes to the market, he will most likely head to a club where he can challenge himself for a championship or a place where he can play a lot.
