Cranfield University Overview



Cranfield University, unlike other UK universities, is a postgraduate public research institute with over 4000 students enrolled in degrees in science, engineering, technology, and management.

Over half of Cranfield University's students attend classes on a part-time basis. More than half of the student body is over the age of 30.

According to the Higher Education Statistics Agency, Cranfield graduates make up the majority of UK engineers with a master's degree in engineering. According to the same source, the university is the best in the world for aerospace, transportation, and automotive engineering.

[Cranfield University is ranked fifth in the United Kingdom for mechanical, aeronautical, and manufacturing](#) fields by QS World Rankings 2020. Other world ranking institutes and university guides, such as Times Higher Education, The Times, The Guardian, and others, do not list Cranfield University as a postgraduate educational institute.

Cranfield University's History

Cranfield University, one of the leading engineering postgraduate research and educational institutes in the UK, was founded in 1946 as the College of Aeronautics. The Cranfield Campus was founded on a Royal Air Force base in Bedfordshire, England.

The university underwent numerous developments over the next two decades, with Roxbee Cox (Lord Kings Norton) serving as vice-chair and chair. It helped with aircraft research and design. The university broadened its scope by establishing the Cranfield University School of Management, as well as a manufacturing faculty.

The Royal Charter and degree-awarding powers were granted to the College of Aeronautics in 1969. It was also renamed Cranfield Institute of Technology, elevating it to the level of a full-fledged university.

Silsoe College was formed by the merger of the Institute and the National College of Agricultural Engineering over the next nearly 20 years. In addition, the university collaborated with the Royal Military College of Science.

Cranfield University was renamed after another amendment to the institute's Royal Charter was made in 1993.

The UK university admitted its final batch of undergraduates in 2003 and became entirely post-graduate.

Cranfield has evolved into one of the UK's best post-graduate universities, with excellent taught and research programmes available through the Aerospace School, Transport and Manufacturing School, Water School, Energy and Environment School, Management School, and Cranfield Defence & Security School.

The Cranfield campus is near Cranfield, Bedfordshire, and is part of the Cambridge-Milton Keynes-Oxford corridor. In addition to academic and research facilities, the campus has its own airport, hotels, recreational facilities, housing, and on-campus nurseries and preschools for students' families.

Achievements and Rankings

Cranfield University, as a fully postgraduate institution, does not appear in traditional league tables.

However, in the 2021 Financial Times European Business School Rankings, its Cranfield School of Management was ranked among the top 10 business schools in the UK and 34th in Europe.

Furthermore, in the full-time MBA ranking for 2021, its full-time [MBA programme](#) is ranked 5th in the UK and 60th globally.

Furthermore, our business school's triple accreditation and frequent recognition in global rankings place us in the top 1% of the world's elite business schools.

[Cranfield University](#) has a Student's Association that works for student welfare and organizes various events throughout the academic year.

There is a nursery and preschool on campus for students with school-age children. This is an important addition because Cranfield students are mostly adults with families and professional careers.

This UK university also supports all students' mental health and wellbeing by offering free counselling services through qualified counsellors. Cranfield students can also seek help and advice from the Big White Wall online community at any time of day.

Cranfield also offers guidance, advice, and Disabled Students' Allowance to students with disabilities. Exams are also modified as needed by the university.

The campus also has a Careers Service department that assists graduates in finding placements and advises students interested in starting their own businesses.

Students' Lives

While the Cranfield campus has a bank, post office, shops, and bars, students can find more recreational opportunities in Milton Keynes, Bedford, and Oxford.

Cranfield students have access to industrial and large-scale facilities such as cabin evacuation, flying, welding, sol dynamics, and biomechanics labs, off-road testing facility,

equipment crash testing facilities, flight deck simulator, oil and gas engineering rigs, experimental farm, and more, in addition to a thriving social life on and off campus.

With three libraries, over 200 research databases, 22,000 e-journals, and an extensive collection of books, software applications, learning tools, computing facilities, and specialist support, the university has also dedicated resources to its library and information services.

Living Quarters

Students who choose to live on campus in dorms have a variety of options, including self-catered and catered halls for various budgets. Students can also choose between en suite rooms and flats with shared bathrooms.

Because more than half of the population is over 30 and already employed, family homes and apartments are also available on a short-term basis.

All accommodation types, from shared halls to flats, are fully furnished and have internet access.

Transport

The campus is close to Cranfield Village, Milton Keynes, and Bedford. Students can travel between these locations using Uno buses and other bus connections. If you want to go to London, you can do so in 45 minutes using the mainline railway services.

All campus facilities are within walking distance and can be reached on foot. The airport of Luton is also nearby. Aside from that, students can use car-hailing services like Uber to get around campus.

Location

Cranfield University's campus is about 40 minutes by train from central London, with Milton Keynes and Bedford being the closest towns. The university is conveniently located near London Luton airport, and Heathrow, Gatwick, and Stansted airports are all easily accessible by train or coach.

Cranfield Defence and Security is approximately 50 minutes by train from London and 25 minutes from Bristol. Bath, Cheltenham, Bristol, and Oxford are all within an hour's drive, and London is less than two hours.
