Who can study in Germany for free?

If you are not from the EU, you must obtain a residence permit before entering the country.

Why are public universities in Germany free of charge?

Tuition fees are only charged by a few [public educational institutions](#). The German government is accommodating in meeting immigrants' economic and social needs. They place such a high value on education that they want the brightest students to study in the country and to stay after they graduate. This is a major reason why international students can take advantage of this opportunity.

Does free tuition equate to not very good performance in education?

The fact that they are free does not imply that they are of poor quality. Many well-known German universities consistently rank in global university rankings, demonstrating that Germany is one of the best study destinations in the world.

Are there any tuition fees in Germany?

There aren't any. In Germany, learning is free of charge. There are, however, some exceptions, such as:

- Almost 100 private universities in the country.
- German universities are categorised between consecutive and non-consecutive master's programs. (E.g. Executive MBAs).
- Public universities in the Baden-Württemberg state. It has the power to charge tuition fees from non-EU/EEA students in the universities located in Stuttgart, Mannheim, Karlsruhe, Heidelberg, Freiburg, and many others.
- Universities in the federal states. They expect you to pay a tuition fee if you plan to pursue a secondary degree called Zweitstudium.
