How to make sure that you're Mac Doesn't Get Infected

Preventions are better than cure, and that applies to computer viruses as well. While nobody can guarantee your Mac will never get infected, there are a few things you can do to make it harder to get a virus on a Mac.

Malicious software usually gets picked up while browsing or downloading stuff off the internet. Sometimes, you may be tricked into downloading something that is not what it pretends to be.

- Download software only from trusted sources, such as iTunes or official websites
- Never fill in personal information in forms unless you know exactly what they are for. On a similar note, never mention personal information, passwords or usernames online in public spaces, such as forums, comments sections or social media.
- Avoid clicking pop up ads or ads that sound too good to be true
- If it's at all possible, disable Java and Acrobat Reader. Both Java and Acrobat Reader are known to have security flaws that might allow malicious content to leak into your computer.
- Keep your firewall enabled at all times.
