These 6 tips will help you achieve the look you want without breaking a sweat.


1. Colors

There are a number of options when it comes to styling silver with colors. As a general rule, stay away from neon colors. The brightness tends to distract from the intricate handmade silver necklace with fine details on the ornament. Most <u>silver ornaments</u> look beautiful with black, white and gray colored outfits. When decorating with Kempu, Kundan and CZ stones, silver works best with maroon, dark blue, dark green and other similar dark colors by complementing them. Styling layered silver chains or single chains with a single pendant will enhance the look of your western outfit, be it jeans, skirts or dresses.



2. Patterns

It is recommended that if the outfit you are wearing is simple and soft without any bold patterns, you can experiment with bold jewelry. Off the shoulder dresses or shrug tops would look gorgeous with a semi-gem studded choker. However, if the outfit has heavy patterns, then it is recommended to wear minimal silver jewelry such as a pendant, a delicate bracelet or **<u>finger rings</u>**.



3. Formal wear and silverware

Who said jewelry and office wear don't go hand in hand? You'd be surprised how well minimal silver jewelry can be styled with formal office wear. Whether it's pantsuits, skirts and full-sleeved shirts or formal dresses, you can now style them with chunky jewelery or minimal silver jewelery to add some oomph to your office look. A formal white shirt and casual skirt with an elaborate <u>silver necklace</u> is another look you shouldn't hesitate to pull off.

Layered necklaces, silver bracelets or <u>silver earrings</u> would be the perfect addition to your formal wear.



4. Don't forget to fix your ankles, hair and nose
