

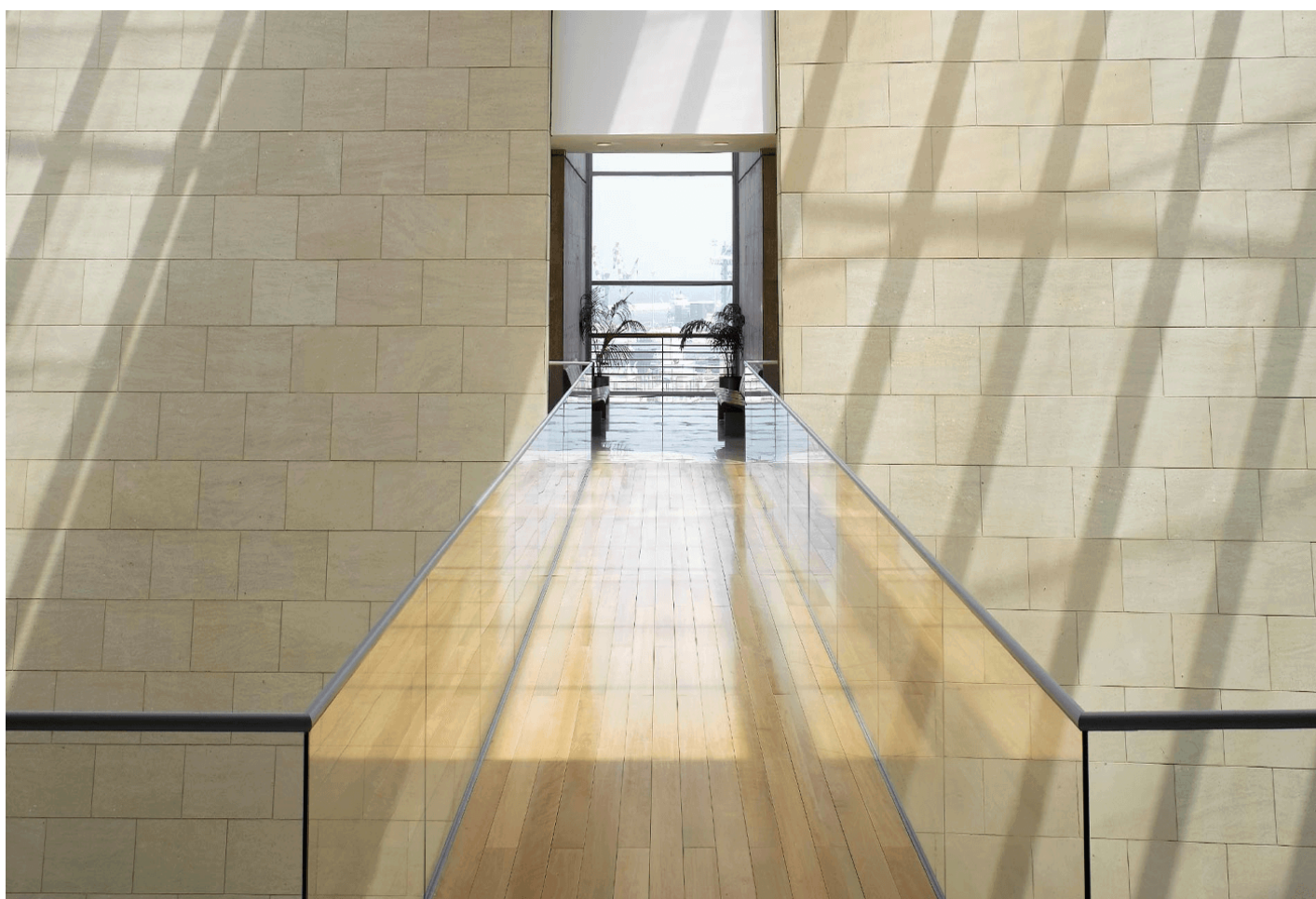

To prevent stains while being installed, you can seal your stone slabs before laying them out or wait a year before applying the sealer to give the stone a lovely worn appearance. Depending

on how porous your Sandstone has become, it is advised to seal it periodically.
