## JEE Advanced Question Paper with Answer Keys (2012 to 2021) – Previous Year Question Papers

The JEE candidates who successfully clear the JEE Main and are among the top 2,50,000 are eligible to appear for the JEE Advanced exam. The exam is conducted in a computer-based mode and is held once every year. The JEE entrance exam is conducted to offer admission into the top IITs in the country. The JEE Advanced exam is conducted after the results of the JEE Main exam are announced. There are seven IITs that conduct the entrance exam on rotation. The IITs that will conduct the exam are IIT Kanpur, IIT Kharagpur, IIT Roorkee, IIT Delhi, IIT Madras, IIT Bombay, and IIT Guwahati. The JEE Advanced exam will be conducted by one of these institutions every year. The admissions to the IITs take place on the basis of the ranks obtained in the JEE Advanced exam. The JEE Advanced exam is conducted in an online Computer-Based Test (CBT) mode and it consists of two papers. The timings for Paper-1 are 9:00 am to 12:00 pm while the timings for paper-2 are from 2:30 pm to 5:30 pm. The JEE candidates have to register themselves online for the computer-based entrance exam. The questions in the two papers are based on the topics covered in the JEE Advanced Syllabus. Appearing for both the papers is mandatory for all the JEE aspirants. Getting a good rank in the exam requires a lot of hard work and dedication. Solving the **JEE Advanced question papers** will undoubtedly help the students in their exam preparation.
