1) Period of Stay

- If you graduated from a German institution and operated in Germany over two years on the residence permit after finishing your studies, you are eligible for the PR visa.
- · After working in the nation for 21–33 months and having an EU Blue Card, you can apply for a PR visa.
- · After three years as a self-employed individual with a provisional residence status, you could apply for permanent residency.

2) Professional Qualification and Earnings

You can seek for a Germany PR right away if you are a highly skilled professional with an annual income of more than 84,000 Euros.

You can earn your PR right away if you have specialized technical knowledge or are active in academic teaching or research. You'll need the following items for this:

- · Evidence of your employment offer
- · Financial means of subsistence
- · Adaptability to the native culture
- · German Language Proficiency

To earn PR, you must be able to communicate in German. It is necessary to have a B1 level of German, which should be very simple if you have lived in the nation for more than two years. Aside from that, you'll need to be familiar with German culture.

Permanent Residency in Germany Has Its Advantages

You will be eligible for greater benefits as a permanent resident in Germany than you were as a skilled migrant. This includes the following:

- · Your residence permit does not need to be renewed every few years.
- · Even if it is unrelated to your qualifications or degree, you will be able to shift employment or start a business. If you lose your job, you will be eligible for German social security benefits such as unemployment compensation.
- · If you intend to study at a German institution, you could apply for financial aid.
- · If you wish to buy real estate in Germany, you can receive a bank loan.
