- Personal attention (including dressing, bathing, and toilet assistance)
- Emergency services are available around the clock.
- Recreational and social activities.

There are frequently substantial wait times for suitable lodging. Moving into a nursing home can also be made much easier if you plan ahead.

Discuss what services you'll require with your family and caregivers. Before phoning around to different nursing homes, think about what services are important to you.

Consider the following questions:

• What daily activities (bathing, clothing, toileting assistance, eating) do I require assistance with?

• How often do I require assistance?

Ask about vacancies, admission standards, level of care provided, and participation in government-funded health insurance alternatives before organising a visit to the <u>nursing</u> <u>homes</u> you're interested in.
