Exposed Storages and Shelving



Farmhouse Sink for Country Kitchen





Neutral Colour Palettes



Choosing Worktops for Country Kitchen Idea

Worktops made of high-quality stone or wood are the norm in country-style kitchens. In a typical country style kitchen, wooden worktops are perhaps the most prevalent surface. Wood does need some upkeep, for instance, spills should be cleaned up right once, and you should oil it frequently to keep it looking good.


The rustic kitchen will seem more appealing with a matte finish.

Worktops made of <u>quartz</u> or <u>granite</u> are the sole options for a truly grand house appearance. Traditional hues like navy blue and forest green stand out well against the cool white quartz. If you decide to use granite, use natural reds, browns, and cream-coloured blends instead of black as the characteristic brilliance of these colours makes a strong statement in a country style kitchen.

Your splashback can also have a marbled appearance to add a touch of elegance.

Avoid anything too bright or sparkly if you decide to use stone because it won't fit the rustic theme.

Although <u>engineered worktops</u> cost higher and demand specialised installation, they can provide a stone look with increased durability.



For both elegance and usability, consider combining materials when designing rural kitchens. Use a more durable material in regions that are more prone to be burned and scuffed, saving the more expensive materials, maybe for a breakfast bar.
