


Natural Stone Floors Types:

Travertine:




Quartzite:

Polished

The honed surface is common for bathroom and kitchen floors, thresholds, stair treads, and other areas with heavy foot traffic or damp regions where grip is critical.

Tumbled



Tumbled finishes are rougher and more textured than honed finishes. It will not be as flat and smooth as a honed finish. Tile edges might be slightly rounded or chipped. Travertine tile with a tumbled finish is particularly popular because it evokes an old-world, rustic charm.
