


Most Popular Marble Effect Worktop and


Slabs




Marble Countertop

Why Marble Effect Tiles and Slabs?




If marble is so admired, why were manufacturers compelled to produce a marble effect worktop, right? ...Well, just as every single thing comes with its own pair of pros and cons, marble also has some. The main reasons for the production of marble effect tiles and slabs are:

- Depletion of natural resources: Since marble is a naturally found raw material, its
 continuous extraction to meet the increasing demand of the rising population will deplete
 the resource. So, manufacturers are coming up with technologically produced
 alternatives to fulfil the need.
- Marble is porous: Although the softness of marble is an advantage for carving beautiful structures, its porosity becomes a drawback when installed in wet areas like bathrooms and sinks.
- Frequent Sealing Required: As mentioned above, the porousness of marble limits its use
 to wet areas. So a marble surface requires frequent sealing to be used as kitchen
 splashbacks, bathroom vanity, shower trays, bathroom splashbacks, kitchen worktops

and every other area that might be prone to spills and stains. This regular requirement makes it a drawback amongst customers with a busy life schedules.

 Not Stain Resistant: Since it is porous, without sealing, it tends to show stains and blemishes, which makes it hard to use in busy areas like kitchens that frequently deal with citrus juices and coloured wines.

Is Marble High-Maintenance?





It is not high-maintenance but, since it requires a little more attention than its other counterparts, people regard it as so. But I guess it's worth the effort, considering its breathtaking beauty.





Calacatta Grigio Quartz

It exhibits a white background colour topped with warm grey coloured veins that are distributed non-uniformly. The veins appear lighter in some areas and darker in others, thinner in some and thicker in others.

You will be delighted to run your palms or fingers above the soft and smooth surface of this marble effect worktop. The slabs are available in large format of 3200*1600 as well as tiles. And you can get both 20mm quartz worktops and 30mm quartz worktops.

Apollo Quartz




