



Picking Up The Lashes With Right Tweezers to Make a Volume Fan

All would agree that one of the most challenging aspects of making volume fans is choosing the right **volume lash tweezers**. Most of us are searching for the right tweezer to build our lash fans.

Below are some ideas that could support you before you go on wasting much money when you put **classic lash tweezers** to the test.

Closeness on the tip

When buying the volume tweezers, look for the tweezers that close 100 percent on its advice. They are supposed to have a tight hold and not too loose at the tip. The sharper the tip will be the best grip it will give to pick up the lash.

Why do most of the **classic lash tweezers** let the lash extensions slip through the tip? The most popular explanation is that you might hold it lightly through its end, which causes one or more of the lashes to move away.

If you focus on squeezing the tips a bit too tight and hold it from fan formation to natural lash implementation, you can see a massive change in your tweezers' results. It is simple to loosen your grip without even realizing it. The tiniest opening will make it possible for your volume fan to cross sideways.

The accuracy to hold

When you evaluate your new pair of **volume lash tweezers**, check them by making a few lash fans and noticing which angle they work best. One thing to consider that quality lashes differ in diameters and fall out from the end of the tweezers.

The different diameters of lashes trigger some to pick up and the thinner ones to roll out because the tweezer tightness around the denser lashes, enabling the slightly thinner ones to fall off.

The most reliable eyelash extension companies will not assure that anything less than 0.7mm will be uniform. It means that anything less than 0.5mm will be challenging to get a good hold with any tweezers.

Angle of adjustment

When you check the tweezers, try holding the lash extensions from various aspects. This will give a perfect view of buying the correct **volume lash tweezers** for making your volume fan.

Try catching the lash at 90 degrees and let the tweezer catch the fan straight. Check different tweezers at the store and try grabbing from various angles.

Tweezer tip:

Do you have a draw full of classic lash tweezers that do not work? Use them to cover the inner and outer lashes. They work best to get into those rough corners of the nose.
