

Understanding Canesten Tablets: Uses, Variations and Interactions

This medication, <u>Canesten tablet</u>, falls under the category of antifungal medications. It is primarily used to treat most vaginal yeast infections. Its mechanism affects destroying the excess yeast responsible for the infection.

Upon commencing this medication, improvements in the symptoms of a vaginal yeast infection should manifest within several hours. However, complete resolution of symptoms might take up to a week.

Clotrimazole comes in different forms:

- Canesten Combi 1 Day ComforTAB + External Cream
- Canesten Combi 1 Day Internal and External Cream
- Canesten 1 Day Internal Cream (10% clotrimazole)
- Canesten Combi 3 Day ComforTAB + External Cream
- Canesten Comfortab 1
- Canesten Comfortab 3
- Canesten 3 Day Internal Cream (2% clotrimazole)
- Canesten 6 Day Internal Cream (1% clotrimazole)
- Canesten External Cream (1% clotrimazole)
- Canesten External Cream Refill (1% clotrimazole)

Each of these formulations contains varying amounts of clotrimazole & different inactive ingredients and use in various way.

For example; Canesten GYN 1 DAY is designed to ease gynecological inflammations in the vagina and vulva. It addresses symptoms like itching, redness, burning, swelling, soreness, and whitish discharge. This vaginal tablet is specifically formulated for women and girls aged 12 years and older.
