The name Emily also shares a connection to strength. In Old French, the name Emily derives from the word "emilie" meaning "work" or "striving." Just as these hardworking biblical women fundraised to ensure the success of Jesus' earthly ministry, the name Emily represents strength of character through diligent effort. Like Mary Magdalene, Joanna and Susanna 💪, a woman named Emily demonstrates strength in using what she has to bless others through acts of kindness, compassion, and generosity.

While Emily may seem like a simple, sweet name 😊, its origin and biblical roots reveal great depth of meaning. When viewed through a spiritual lens, an Emily signifies one who faithfully supports the work of God, just as these key female figures did in the life and ministry of our Lord Jesus Christ nearly 2000 years ago.
