## **NATURAL STONE KITCHEN TILES**

For kitchen walls and floors, consider using marble, limestone, travertine, and slate. Keep in mind that natural stone needs to be sealed to protect it and should only be cleaned with chemicals made specifically for stone; regular household cleaners are too abrasive. Natural

stone tiles can be finished with polished, smooth, modern honed, or aged-looking tumbled surfaces.

There are remarkable dark and coloured variations of marble in addition to the more common grey and white tones. Similar to veining, veining can be subtle or obvious. Never install glossy marble in a kitchen because it presents a slip danger. A lot of limestone is available. Its beige, grey, cream, and dark colours allow for a wide variety of aesthetics. The durability of limestones might vary, so if you're using it as a floor, make sure the stone is robust enough for a space with high activity.

Although there are also warmer tones, beige and grey are the most common colours for travertine. Natural voids exist on the surface, which are filled either by most finishes or by grouting the tiles. Slate produces a rough surface that might improve foothold at floor level or provide character to a kitchen wall. Slate is a striking stone because of its deep, rich colours.

If you want to make the kitchen appear brighter, choose wall tiles with a gloss surface because they reflect light. If you're planning a small kitchen, they can be an excellent purchase to help make it appear larger. They are very simple to clean. Flat is the finish of matte tiles. They won't be as noticeable as a gloss version that catches the light, but they can be a terrific way to add subtle contrast with other kitchen surfaces in, say, an all-white scheme.
