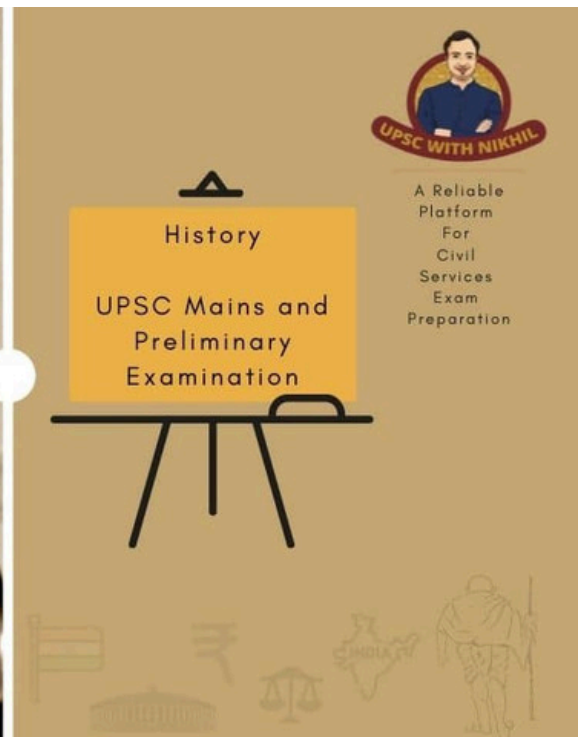




The Mountbatten Plan Of 1947 And Its Consequences
