Amazing and Exotic Layout

The structure is made such that it provides get right of entry to groundwater during the year. The structure consists of a chain of diverging and converging steps leading to the water table. The whole property is made from purple sandstone and runs over 200 ft deep. It has to get entry to degrees of water and a separate tank at the lowest. The stepwell at first had a Persian Wheel which turned into pushed with the assist of bullocks by way of making them walk in a circle over the platform at the pinnacle to attract water.

Toorji Ka Jhalra also has tiny chambers/ cabinets beneath most staircases that in all

likelihood were used to maintain a lantern or light a fireplace to useful resource mountain climbing up and down for the duration of the nighttime. The Jhalra is likewise decorated with sculptures of Gods, Goddesses and animals. The water spouts inside the stepwell also are carved out of stone. The topmost stage has a patio in the traditional Chhatri style. The degrees of the stepwell also have protruding Jharokhas and a hall from wherein you can still get an amazing pinnacle view of the property. The walls have a few carvings but the structure normally is easy but quite elegant.

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
