Any foreign student in the United Kingdom is normally permitted to work up to 20 hours per week during the academic year and up to full-time during the summer. Before beginning any job, verify with your school's international advisor; you don't want to be in breach of your visa, and restrictions change frequently. Remember that finding a job is not always easy, so counting on work income to pay for your entire education is not a good option. Unless you have a job lined up through your school before you arrive, you should budget for the first year of your study to be funded entirely by yourself.

4) Courses with a shorter duration

The UK education system offers shorter and more rigorous courses than many other nations, allowing you to graduate sooner while maintaining high quality. While an undergraduate programmed can be completed in three years, a graduate programmed can be completed in just one year. This not only saves you time, but it also saves you money on tuition and living expenses.

5) Entry point to Europe
