

## Jaipur National University Main Campus Jaipur



The university was founded in 2007. The university is a private institution. The university's campus covers an area of 170 acres of land. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) has accredited <u>Jaipur National University</u>, and the university is recognised by the University Grants Commission (UGC). The Bar Council of India, the Medical Council of India, and many other organisations recognise Jaipur National University. The university's mission and vision are to create and sustain excellence in education while developing leaders to serve society and the nation. NIRF has ranked Jaipur National University 72nd in the pharmacy category for 2021.

Science, art, law, management, engineering, and many other fields are covered in the courses. Diploma, undergraduate, postgraduate, M.Phil, and Ph.D programmes are available at Jaipur National University. Admission to Jaipur National University is based on merit and a personal interview (B.Com/B.B.A/B.C.A/B.Sc. (H)/B.A./M.Sc.) or an entrance test and a personal interview (B.A. L.L.B/B.Tech/B.Sc. (H) (Agriculture/Horticulture)/M.C.A/M.Tech/M.B.A (M.D.). The total number of faculty at the university is 522, and the total number of students enrolled is 25664. As a result, the student-to-teacher ratio at the university is 49:1.

JNU main campus jaipur provides a library, a boys hostel, a girls hostel, an auditorium, a cafeteria, a well-maintained IT infrastructure, a gym, sports, a medical clinic, laboratories, a bank/ATM, and many other amenities. The university also has a placement office known as the Corporate Resource Cell (CRC). The placement cell organises various activities such as training programmes, mock interviews, group discussions, and so on. Scholarships are available to both meritorious students and needy applicants at the university. After meeting the eligibility requirements, students can apply for the scholarships. The university offers numerous clubs, committees, and societies for students' overall development.
