Hair transplant scar camouflage, also known as scar tattooing or scar solutions, is a method of hiding a [hair transplant scar cover up](#) using special pigments. To be effective, the area must be lighter than the surrounding skin. It must also not appear raised. This process may take several treatments to achieve the desired results. Because the scar tissue is more unpredictable than undamaged skin, several sessions are necessary for the most effective camouflage.

In some cases, hair transplant scars can be covered up with Scalp Micropigmentation, a new form of hair restoration treatment. Scalp Micropigmentation is a relatively inexpensive treatment that offers instant results with no downtime. It also works well for those who are having other treatments for hair loss. In addition to scalp micropigmentation, a hair transplant scar can benefit from scar camouflage and scalp micropigmentation. FUE hair restoration involves the removal of a strip of hair from the donor area, usually at the back of the scalp. Hair is then transplanted at the recipient site. FUE hair restoration may leave linear scars in the donor area. The length of the scar depends on the surgeon's skill. The scars will eventually heal. But it will be a long time before you can get back to your normal self.

A hair transplant scar may take several months to disappear completely. New hair growth can take anywhere from 6 months to eighteen months. The scar will not be completely hidden for at least six months, so you should be patient and follow the doctor's instructions carefully. You

should expect to have a scar for at least a year following the procedure. It will be hard to see it in the first few months, but after that, you will see the results.

There are three basic types of hair transplant scar treatments. FUE can correct an uneven scar from an earlier surgery. This technique begins with shaving the scalp near the scar. Then, individual hair follicles are harvested through small punches and stored in solution. The doctor may also use a Fraxel laser to smooth the scar. This type of surgery is not for everyone and requires additional scalp skin. You should consider all three before making the decision to undergo hair transplant surgery.

FUE is the most advanced form of hair transplant surgery. The FUE method involves the extraction of one or four groups of hair. These hair grafts are then implanted into the recipient area. The result is a scar that looks like a small circle around the donor site. The scar will be smaller than other hair transplant techniques and will not be as obvious as they would be if the donor site were not scarred.

Surgical treatments such as FUE and FUT may leave visible scars. This may discourage some patients from getting hair transplants, but with the help of an appropriate hair transplant scar cover up, the patient may be able to avoid this embarrassment. However, scarring is not a reflection on the skills of the doctor, but a common natural risk of both procedures. The best hair restoration procedures will help hide these scars and improve patient satisfaction.
