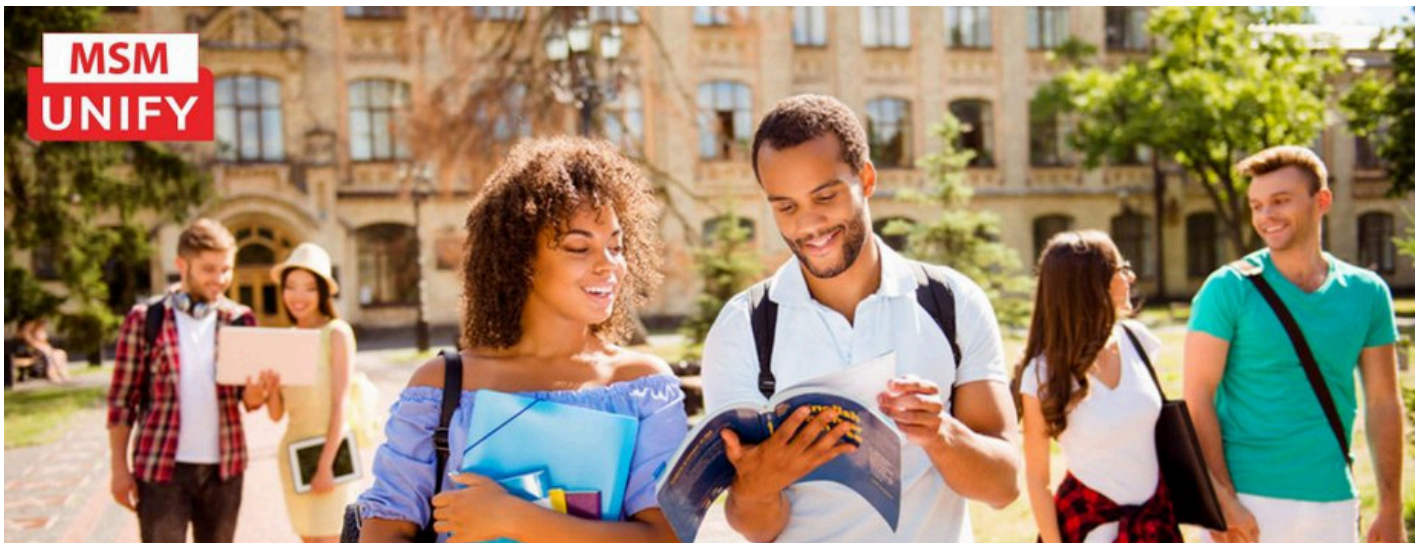

The International Day of Education 2022 aims to spark discussion about strengthening education as a public good, guiding the digital transformation, supporting teachers, protecting the environment, and unleashing every individual's potential to contribute to collective well-being and shared home.

UNESCO Global Report

In November 2021, UNESCO will release a new global report titled "Reimagining our Futures Together: A New Social Contract for Education."

The report, which drew over a million people from around the world to participate in a global consultation process, calls on society to collaborate for the common good and is based on the belief that education should correct injustices while also changing the future.

In order to eliminate discrimination, marginalisation, and exclusion, the **UNESCO Future of Education** report calls for a commitment to social discourse and thought.

The report emphasises the importance of establishing a new educational, social compact through cross-border information exchange and millions of individual and collective acts of courage, leadership, resistance, creativity, and caring.

It would also necessitate contributions from all stakeholders, including teachers, students, academics, research centres, institutions, governments, and non-governmental organisations, according to the report.

The first-ever International Day of Education was observed on January 24, 2019, and it will be commemorated for the fourth time this year to highlight that education is one of everyone's basic rights.

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
