



# How to Write an Essay Fast in an Exam

## Write an Essay Under Exam Conditions

### Time:

You're going to have a defined time to compose every essay. Look for about 10 minutes of preparation and thought. You may think this is a big chunk of the time available, but it's time well spent. Writing a successful essay involves a synthesis of content that can't be achieved within **20-30 minutes** of the study. This will save you time overall, because it will ensure that you do much of the thinking at the beginning, allowing you to spend the majority of your time writing. **In exams conditions** most of the students don't know how to start an exams see the essay questions then start writing at the middle of the paper stop working and don't know what to write next.

**Don't worry too much** because with some tricks and tips for writing essays in exams will help you here. This that ends up being a pretty heavy post so let's get straight out cracking.



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### Some Practices and Preparation before the exam.

Take a look at the question from the last examination. Would you ask yourself to apply the principle to historical or current events? Have you ever had to compare theories? Have you ever had to justify an argument? Imagine yourself in the position of teacher-what did the teacher emphasize? These are the main ideas of the course?

You can decide to write a review of each of the theories you have explored or a brief overview of the historical or current events you have researched. Depend on clarification, conciseness, and comprehension of the discrepancies between theories.

You may have to support the case with proof, and this can include memorizing some of the main facts, or names of theories, etc.

- Spend a significant amount of time on your thesis statement
- Please refer to the statement of a thesis when you write to the body

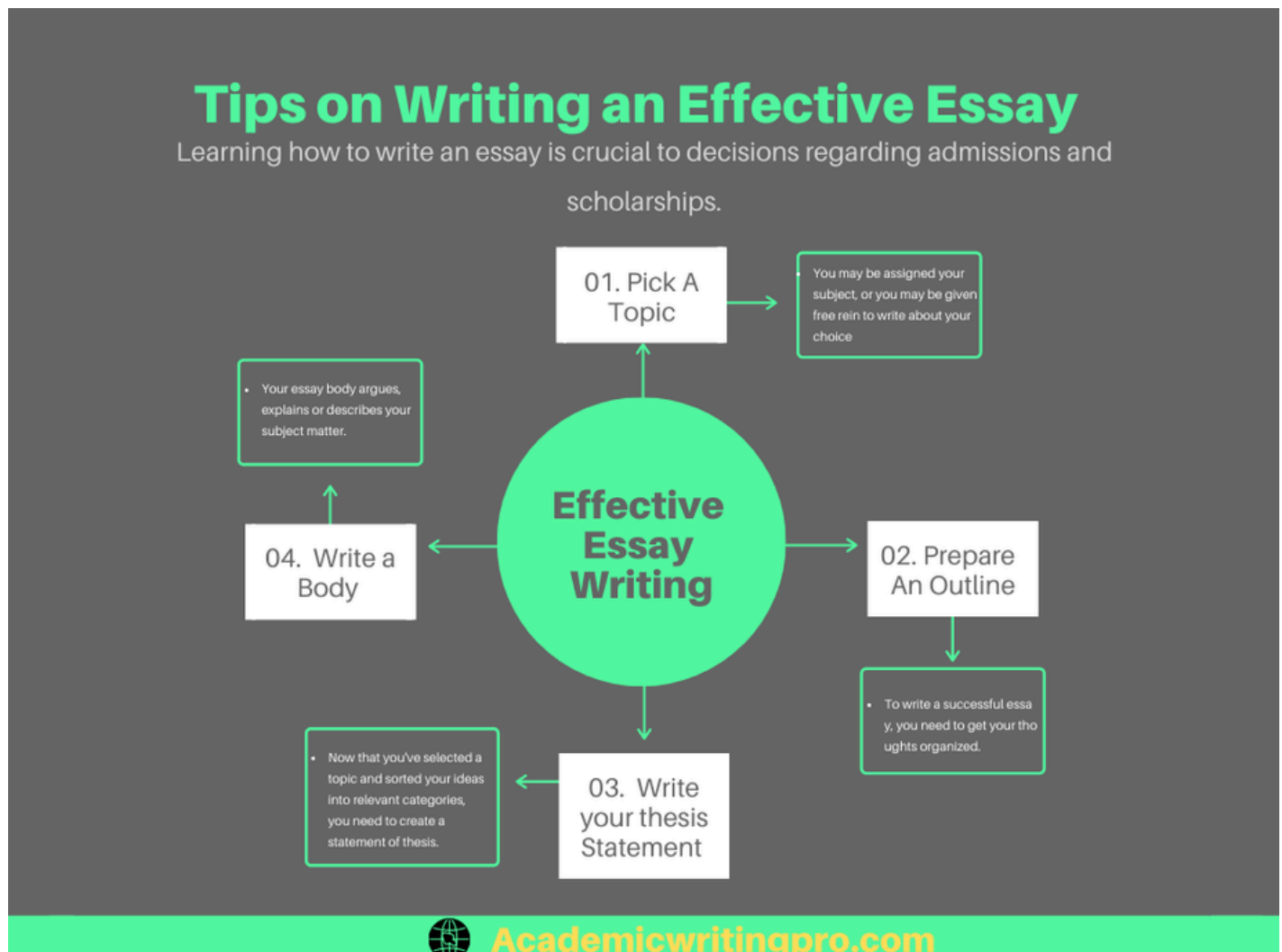
### Read the Question Carefully.

The first thing to do is to research the problem. You're not being asked to write everything you know about. A particular question that requires a response that is specifically connected to it is being posed of you.

After scanning the essay question, several students start writing furiously. It's not a good thing to do it.

### Brainstorm:

The next thing you can do is brainstorm until you're sure what the problem is asking of you. Simply write down in short notes everything you can think of and in no particular order just to get it out of your head and on paper. You can arrange it later, but you must first have the necessary points and information to include.



## Try the following things in exams:

- Write down all the details you needed to **memorize** for the test in a note form, it's easy to understand.
- **Answer all of the exam questions.** When you answer each question when you experience it, you might provide some facts or proof to one question that is more suitable for another. Please make careful to describe all the pieces of the issue.
- Before dealing with the body of the essay, write an outline summarizing the key points of support. Test to make sure that you answer all aspects of the issue. A coherent composition is one of the most critical aspects of a strong essay.
- Most political science essays challenge you to make some sort of statement. Although there are no right responses, there are more and fewer convincing replies.
- Let every paragraph catch your attention by starting with a powerful argumentative point that is connected to the central argument of your essay. Then you will move on and explain it and show it.
- Consider keeping your article concise and easy to read. Ideally, the arguments you make within a paragraph will float from one to the other, and each paragraph should be well linked to the next.

## Avoid These Things

- Don't write at the end because you ran out of time or didn't have time to research because you were sick. Request an appointment with your TA to address these problems after the test.

- Instructors are usually very good at identifying student bluffing. They don't give credit for the elaboration of the obvious. When you're confused, you can expand on what you know, as long as it corresponds to the issue.

A strong type of essay is going to help you make the most of what you learn. When you know a little about the subject of the essay, a good style of the essay will cover some of your deficiencies. If you know your things, you will end up writing an excellent essay rather than just a decent one.

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
