- Service Staff. What type of staff will the school have? Exactly what is the school nurse on location? Will the school have a very psychologist or counselor? Exactly what is the librarian in the catering company?
- Principal or Headmaster Turnover. If your school burns through principals, the college have a problem.
- Teacher Turnover. What's the teacher turnover rate on the school? Typically speaking, private schools have higher teacher turnover rates compared to public schools. In addition, smaller private schools have larger turnover compared to larger private schools. However, a tutor turnover rate of 40% or even more may be a sign of problems in the school.

- Will the school have programs for parent involvement?

- What sort of relationship will the school have with local business owners as well as the neighborhood?
- When are applications accepted? What is the waiting list? If so, how long will be the waiting list?
