The metalworking traditions of Andhra Pradesh are equally impressive, particularly in the crafting of intricate jewelry and decorative items. The state is renowned for its Nirmal paintings and Bidriware, each with its unique history and technique.

This metal craft originated from Bidar but has been popular in Andhra Pradesh as well. It involves inlaying fine silver or brass into a blackened alloy of zinc and copper. The result is a stunning contrast between the dark base and the bright metallic inlays, creating intricate patterns and designs. Bidriware items include vases, trays, and decorative pieces, celebrated for their elegance and craftsmanship.

Nirmal is a town known for its unique paintings and wooden craft. These paintings often feature vivid colors and intricate patterns, depicting various themes, from religious icons to everyday life. The craft includes the creation of wooden artifacts with detailed carvings and traditional motifs, reflecting the cultural ethos of the region.

The pottery traditions of <u>Andhra Pradesh</u> are equally noteworthy. The state is famous for its Golla Pottery, which is practiced by the Golla community. This craft includes the making of earthenware pots, bowls, and decorative items, often embellished with intricate designs and traditional motifs.
