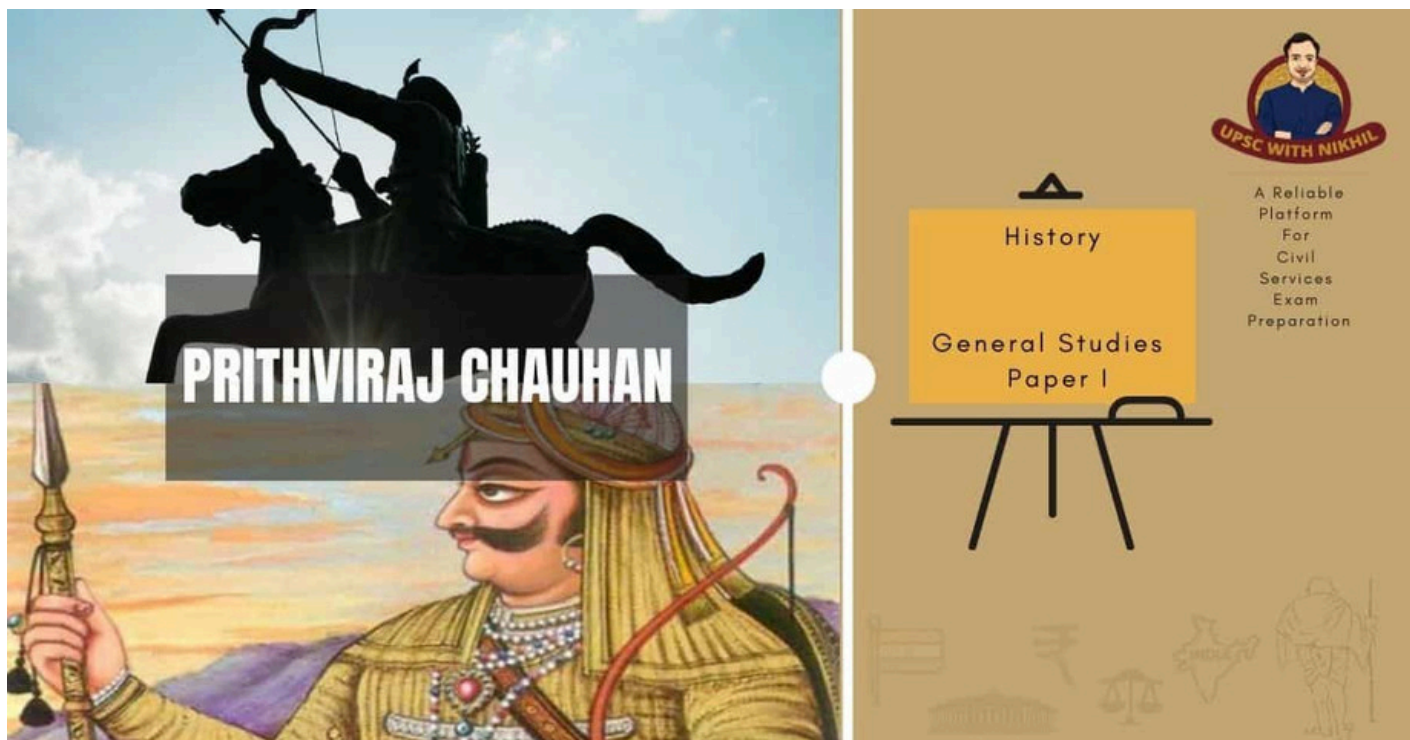




PRITHVIRAJ CHAUHAN | IAS Classes in Nagpur | UPSC with Nikhil

Prithviraj III, otherwise called Prithviraj Chauhan or Rai Pithora, was a Chahaman (Chauhan) tradition ruler from India. After his dad was killed in a fight, he rose to the seat of Ajmer at thirteen years old in 1179. The leader of Delhi, Prithviraj Chauhan's granddad Angam, announced Prithviraj Chauhan as the beneficiary to the seat of Delhi after him. - Prithviraj Chauhan was brought into the world in 1166, the child of Ajmer's top dog, Someshwar Chauhan. He was the remainder of the Chauhan tradition's rulers to sit on Delhi's seat.
- From a youthful age, Prithvi Raj showed his sharpness and splendor by dominating every single military ability.
- He was known for dominating the "Shabdbhedi" method, which included pointing an objective dependent on its sound.
- Because Prithviraj was as yet a minor when he took the seat, his mom, Karpuradevi, was delegated as his official.
