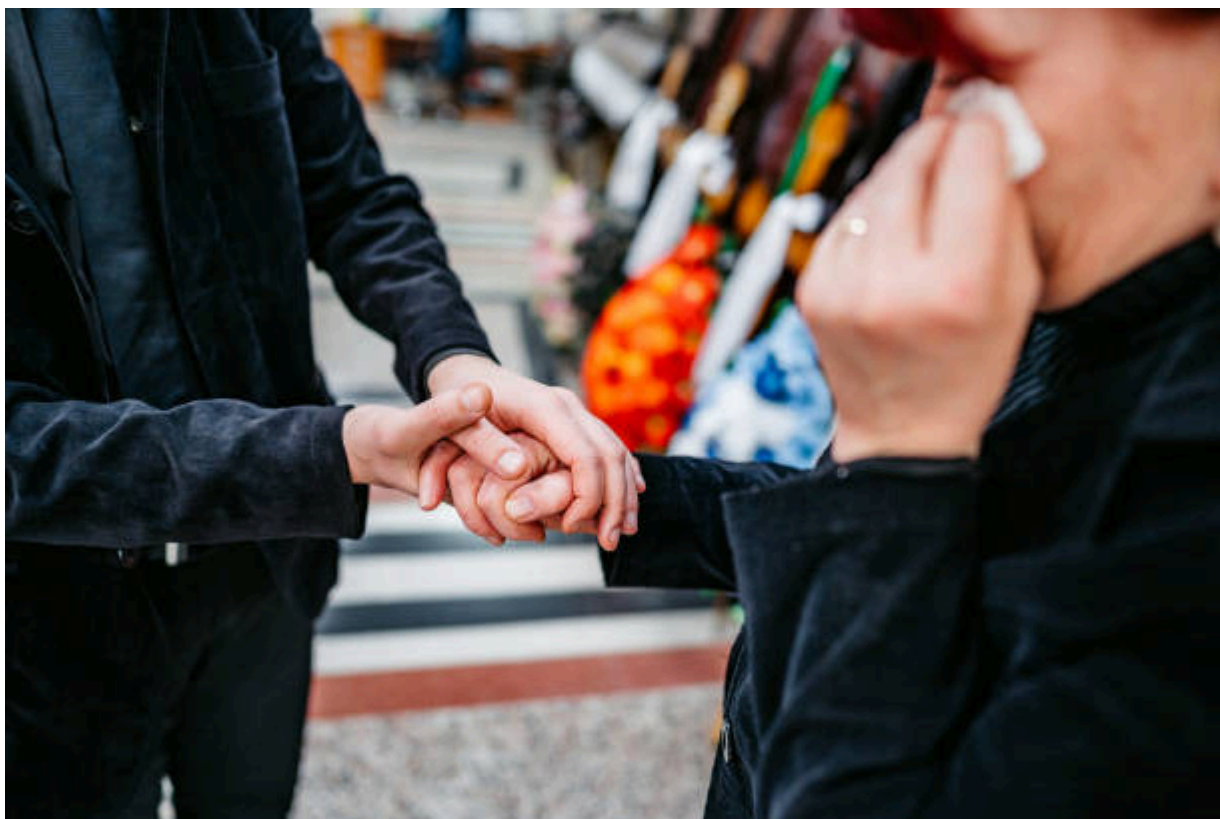




Your Guide to Planning Direct Cremation

People don't usually dream of arranging a final resting place for their loved ones, especially those who are younger than them. However, life can be unfair at times.



Unless there was an advance arrangement made for the cremation service, you might have to make the decision as the surviving family member. And the easiest option is to opt for [Direct cremation in Kelowna](#). This is because you no longer have to plan a funeral or a service. Instead, the consultants at the cremation home take care of the arrangements for you.

Here are some tips that might assist you in planning direct cremation easily.

1- Choose the crematorium

You can either work with a crematorium or hire a funeral home that takes care of the cremation. Due to the popularity of cremation in recent years, many funeral homes have started providing services for direct cremation Kelowna, meaning you shouldn't have a problem finding one.

However, it is worth noting that cremation at funeral homes can prove more costly than working with a crematorium.

2- Obtain the death certificate

Typically, the funeral director is responsible for acquiring the death certificate. If that isn't the case, then you might require contacting the vital office in your locality to obtain the same.

If possible, obtain at least ten copies of the certificate so you can submit them to different institutions when resolving the final affairs of your loved ones.

3- Get the deceased transported

In most cases, the crematorium or funeral home takes care of transporting the deceased for free. However, if the body isn't in the same town, you may require paying a minimal fee. In case the deceased needs to be transported across the state line, you may have to pay a larger fee.

Cross-check with the funeral home for their transportation fee.

4- Fill out the necessary paperwork

You may require filling out a few documents before the cremation takes place. And since the forms vary from state to state, it is best to download them on your own to stay assured that you have acquired the right ones.

5- Choose a casket

Just because you are choosing a cremation service, it doesn't mean you won't require a casket. The body needs to be placed somewhere, right?

You can go with simple pinewood or cardboard boxes for cremation service. Also, decide what you would like the deceased to wear for cremation.

6- Choose a container or urn

Lastly, you will require choosing an urn or a container to store the ashes after the direct cremation in Kelowna.

If you decide to spread the ashes, you can hold the ashes in the cardboard box that the cremation service provider typically uses to deliver them.

Over to you

It is evident from the tips mentioned above that direct cremation in Kelowna only requires a little of your help, while the consultants at the crematorium take care of most parts for you.
