

Guide to Earning Your CNA Certification in Pennsylvania

According to BLS data, *Certified Nursing Assistants PA* makes an average hourly income of \$14.71. As the population ages and more medical care are needed throughout the state, CNAs are projected to be in high demand. CNAs can become certified practical nurses or nurse practitioners with time and education. They are an integral element of the healthcare team in Pennsylvania and nationwide because of their devotion and dedication to patient care.

CNA Training near me
