The Diving Bell and the Butterfly (2007) – French film. The true story of how a former Editor in Chief of ELLE magazine suffered a massive stroke, paralyzing his entire body other than his eyes, and was able to write a memoir. 8/25

The Hours (2002) – Three women in different generations are interconnected by the book Mrs Dalloway by Virginia Woolf. 8/25

The Ice Storm (1997) – Different families get intertwined during an ice storm in which both children, youth, and adults join in alcohol and sexual relations. Drama.

The King and the Clown (2005) – Korean film about local clowns who get in trouble for mocking the king. However, the king enjoys their performances as he asks them to be his personal jesters. Comedy-Drama.

The Last Emperor (1987) – Follows the story of Puyi, the last Emperor of China, who was crowned at 3 years of age. Biopic Drama.

Chungking Express (1994) – Chinese film following the romantic stories of two hopeless romantic policemen revolving around a food stall. Rom-Com. (First part is more serious toned, second is more comedic)

Ditto (Also known as Donggam) (2000) – Korean film of college students who talk with each other over the radio, despite a 20 year separation in time. Sci-fi Rom-Com.

Forgetting Sarah Marshall (2008)

Gorgeous (1999) – Chinese Jackie Chan film. A young girl visits Hong Kong in hope for romance and encounters an ethical businessman in the middle of a long-term rivalry. A couple of fight scenes since this is well, Jackie Chan. 8/25

Romance

2046 (2004) – Chinese film following Chow from “In The Mood For Love” as a loose sequel,

and how he deals with being a playboy and a hopeless romantic. Romance Drama.
A Moment To Remember (2004) – Korean film of how a young girl falls in love with a “bad boy” but at the same time, falls sick with Alzheimer's Disease (disease that causes memory loss).
Rom-Com with drama halfway.

A Streetcar Named Desire (1951)

Atonement (2007) – A young girl, who aspires to write, makes a terrible life-changing mistake for the relationship between her older sister and her lover in late 1930s Britain. Romantic Drama.

Brokeback Mountain (2005)

City of Angels (1998) – An angel becomes attracted to a surgeon and decides to be visible to her. Romantic Drama.

Cold Mountain (2003) 8/25

Days of Being Wild (1990) – Chinese film following a playboy's conflict with his adoptive and real mother, the women whose hearts he breaks, and a policeman overseeing his life.
Romantic Drama.

Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind (2004)

Happy Together (1997) – Chinese film. Two gay lovers' on/off relationship leads them stranded in Argentina where they relive their said relationship. 8/25

In the Mood for Love (2000) – Chinese film of two new neighbors find out that their respective spouses are having an affair with each other. They then decide to have one as well. Romantic Drama.

Love Letter (Also known as When I Close My Eyes) (1995) – Japanese film of a woman who lost her fiance, sends him a love letter to his old home (which should no longer exist), but for some reason, she gets a letter back. On the receiving end, we find a woman who looks exactly the same (same actress), and has the same name of the fiance, whom she actually knew back in high school, and the women continue talking about the fiance as emotions of each unfold.

Rom-Com Drama.

Maborosi (Also known as Maboroshi No Hikaru) (1995) – Japanese film of a woman who tries to figure out why, out of nowhere, her husband decided to commit suicide. Pushed into it, she re-marries with a man who lost his love as well. Romantic Drama. This film is VERY slow-paced.

Blue Velvet (1986) – A college student finds a human ear and conducts his own investigation with the help of a police detective's daughter. Mystery Neo-noir.

Brick (2005) – A high school kid finds his ex-girlfriend dead and becomes involved with much more than expected. A pastiche to both American High school melo-drama with hardboiled Neo-noir.

Chinatown (1974) – A private investigator grows too interested in the California Water Wars of the 1930s after he was set up to be involved in the death of a businessman. 8/25

Donnie Darko (2001)

Double Indemnity (1944) – An insurance salesman falls in love with a woman who wants to murder her husband for the money. Mystery Film noir.

Fatal Attraction (1987) – A successful married man has a short affair with a woman who then starts to cling to him, stalk him and his family, and just go berserk with obsession. Thriller Horror Drama.

Fight Club (1999)

Inception (2010)

L.A. Confidential (1997) – In the times of 50s police corruption and the rise of Hollywood, detectives are caught in the midst of murder, organized crimes, and lust. Neo-noir Drama.

Mulholland Drive (2001) – A woman is saved from gunpoint by a car crash, but when she wakes up, remembers nothing. She stumbles upon an aspiring actress, new to Hollywood, and they attempt to solve the mystery of who she was. David Lynch Neo-noir Mystery Thriller.

Mystic River (2003) – The death of the daughter of a former criminal reunites him with his childhood friends: a detective, and a victim of pedophilia many years ago. Mystery Crime Drama.

No Country for Old Men (2007)

Oldboy (2003) – Korean film. A man is trapped in a hotel room for 15 years and when he is suddenly released, he goes around figuring out why. All of my friends had their minds blown.

Neo-noir Thriller/Action with comedy here and there.

Se7en (1995) – Two detectives, one on his last week before retirement, and the other freshly promoted, track down a killer who goes by the seven deadly sins. Neo-noir Thriller Drama.

Strange Days (1995) – In the last days of 1999, virtual reality instruments take over the underworld as a dealer is now involved with a high-profile murder. Neo-noir Thriller.

The Chaser (2008) – Korean film. A former detective, now pimp, follows a case of a man who has been ordering his girls but never returning them. Neo-noir Thriller.

The Insider (1999) – True story about a chemist who tries to reveal secrets of the tobacco industry on 60 Minutes, when he is then threatened by the tobacco companies. Drama Thriller.
