What diseases are treated by urologists?

1. Infertility
2. Kidney stones

What procedures are carried out by urologists?

When assessing your condition, your urology consultant may perform a series of tests in order to identify the issue. The list of tests may include:

1. **Imaging tests**- This includes tests like MRI scans, CT scans or ultrasounds.
2. **Cystoscopy**- This test involves assessing the insides of the urethra and bladder with special equipment called a cystoscope.
3. **Cystogram**- This is an imaging test that helps your urologist to diagnose problems related to your bladder.
4. **Urodynamic testing**- This helps evaluate how well the bladder and urethra are carrying out their respective functions.
5. **PVR urine test**- This test helps to measure the residual amount of urine left within the bladder after urination.
6. **Urinalysis**- This test involves the analysis of your urine sample in order to detect any signs of diseases or conditions.

Urologists are also trained surgeons and they cover a wide range of procedures. Some surgical procedures under the urology [**health care services**](#) include:

1. Kidney transplant
2. Cystectomy
3. Prostatectomy
4. Transurethral resection of the prostate (TURP)
5. Transurethral needle ablation of the prostate (TUNA)
6. Vasectomy
7. Sling procedure for incontinence
8. Biopsies of the prostate, bladder and kidneys
9. Injury-induced damage repair
10. Ureteroscopy
11. Extracorporeal shock wave lithotripsy (ESWL)
