



## 20+ Japanese Names That Mean Death: A Unique or Unconventional Name –

In Japanese culture, names related to death are not generally used due to their dark or ominous connotations. However, there are some names that originated from words or phrases tied to death or the afterlife. Here are a few examples:

Aka means red in Japanese, and Aka can refer to the red color of blood or the flushed complexion of a dead body. Akane is a feminine name related to the color red or scarlet.

Similarly, the name Benkei, originally belonging to a famous monk warrior called Musashibo Benkei, contains the character for funeral, "bo".

Shi, pronounced the same as the word for death, is a common character used in names. Girls' names like Shimako or Shizuka and boys' names like Shirou contain this character. However, they have additional positive meanings like wise child, quiet/calm, or white which take precedence over any death association. Another name using the character for death is Shirō, which translates directly to "death son".

Names involving ghosts or spirits could also connect to death. Yūrei means ghost in Japanese, and Yūki is a feminine name that contains the ghost kanji. Names associated with the afterlife include names like Reikō meaning "soul child" or Yorishiro meaning "the medium between this world and the next". While not wishful thinking names by today's standards, their origins lie in Shinto and Buddhist spiritual beliefs.

Some plant names relate to death as well. For example, the flower yuzuriha, meaning wisteria, contains the character for end or ceasing. Wisteria was viewed as a symbol of an ephemeral life in Japanese poetry. Names like Tsubaki meaning camellia or Momiji meaning maple also reference flowers seen as emblems of falling petals and transient beauty.
