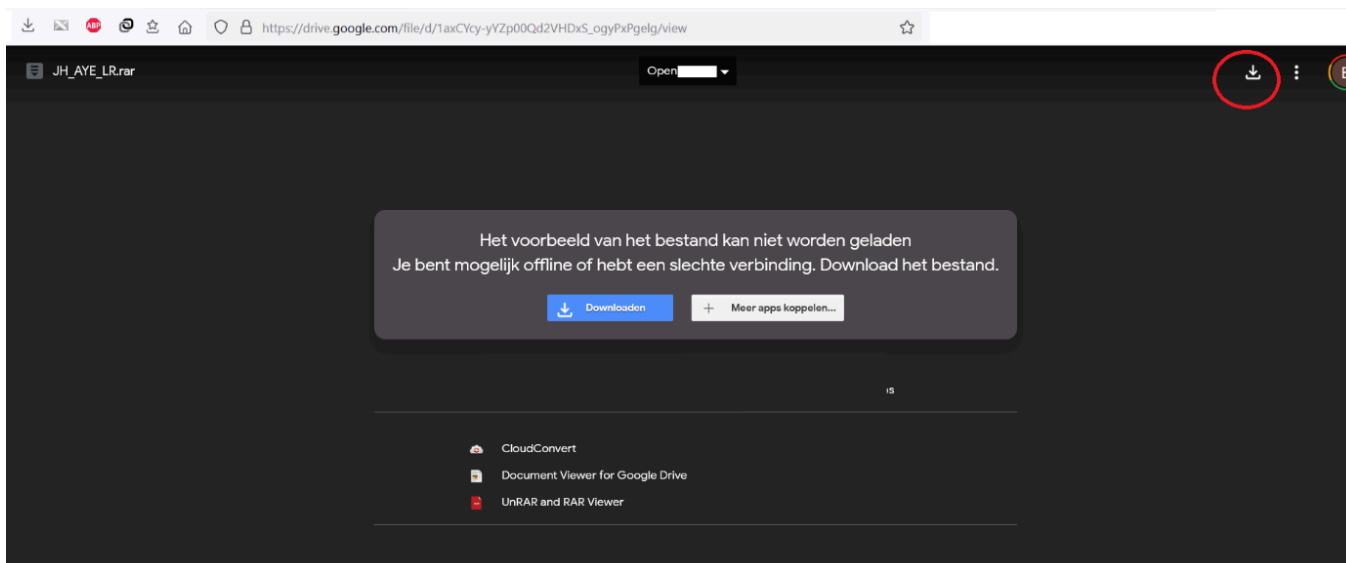

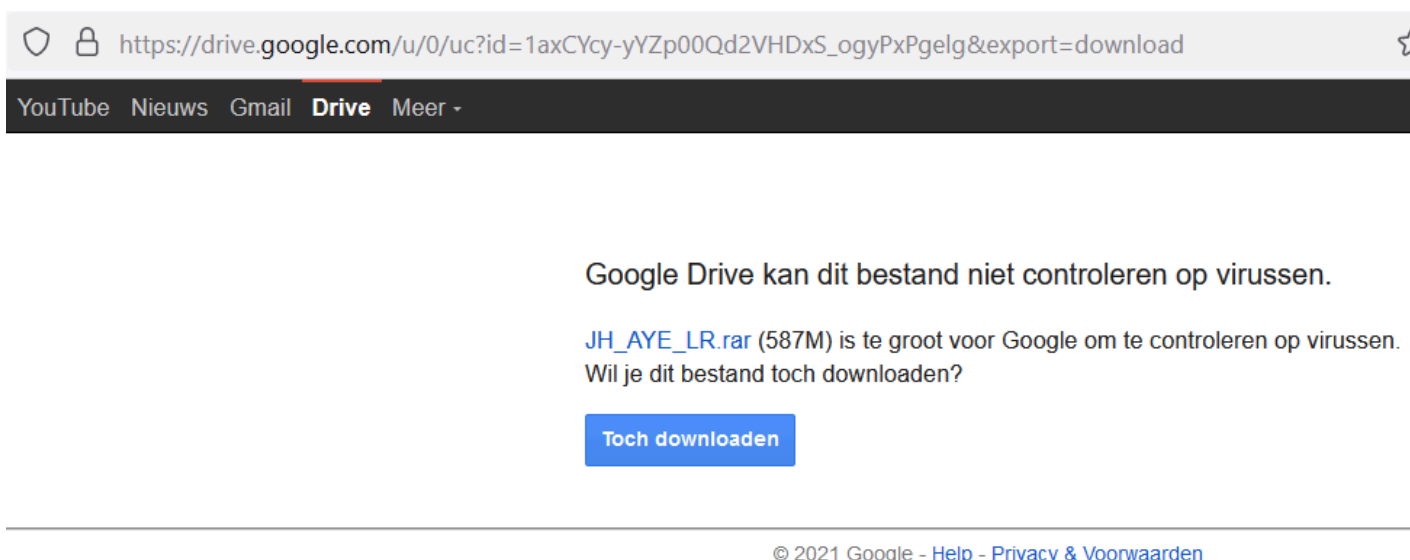

The program will ask for a password, which you can find below the download links on the blog.
