Across Asia, the black snake is linked with rain, divination, protection of homes, and guardianship of treasures. They are thought to have knowledge of healing herbs and secret wisdom unavailable to humans. In parts of China and Japan, snake wine infusions made from black snakes are consumed for their believed medicinal qualities.

To the Maya, the black snake 🐍 represented the forces of fertility and rebirth. Kukulcan, the Plumed Serpent deity, oversaw agricultural cycles and used his slithering body to vanish into the earth or reemerge. The black color signified the rich soil whose nourishment allowed new life to continually spring forth. Plumed Serpent altars show the serpent's scales as maize or crop plants sprouting forth.
