


How to Fix a Leaky Faucet in 5 Easy Steps

1. Turn Off the Water Supply

Before you start, make sure to turn off the water supply to the faucet. You'll usually find the shut-off valves under the sink. Turning off the water ensures that you don't end up with a mess while fixing the faucet.

2. Plug the Drain

Place a sink plug or a rag in the drain to avoid losing any small parts like washers or screws while you work.

3. Remove the Handle

Use a screwdriver to remove the handle of the faucet. Depending on your faucet type, there may be a screw under the handle, or you might need to remove a decorative cap first. Once the handle is off, you'll see the mechanism that controls the flow of water.

4. Inspect the Parts

Check for any worn-out washers, O-rings, or seals. These parts are usually the culprits behind the leak. If they're damaged, replace them with new ones. You can find replacement parts at most hardware stores.

5. Reassemble and Test

Once you've replaced the damaged parts, carefully reassemble the faucet, making sure everything is tightened properly. Turn the water supply back on and test the faucet to ensure the leak is gone.
