

Skrillex Releases New Album "Quest for Fire" Featuring Missy Elliott and Mr. Oizo



Skrillex, the renowned American music producer, has released his second solo studio album, Quest for Fire. The album, which features a number of high-profile guests, including Missy Elliott and French producer Mr. Oizo, was released on February 16th.

Skrillex, whose real name is Sonny John Moore, first gained traction as the lead vocalist of the band From First to Last.

He later became one of the most prominent figures in electronic dance music and has collaborated with many high-profile artists, including Justin Bieber, Diplo, and Beyoncé. With

the release of Quest for Fire, Skrillex once again proves his creative prowess and ability to draw in top talent to create memorable music.
