The “Beige Fox” story gives the sounds of USA English at:

The Beige Fox Truespel Story

This story contains the 40 sounds of USA English:

“That quick beige fox jumped in the air over each thin dog. Look out, I shout, for he’s foiled you again, creating chaos.”

Now written in truespel:

—That kwik beigz faxz jumpd in thee air oever eech thinn daug.
Look out, le shout, for ~~re~~ foild yoe uggen, kree”ueteeng los”nas.—

Rules:

- A tilde (~) indicates truespel; a double tilde (---) starts and ends a phrase.
- Stress is always first syllable or after a double consonant (or quote sign).
- An apostrophe splits two vowels or shows a glottal stop (quote = stressed).

Basically, the above sums up all you need to know about truespel. But it takes a bit of practice to recognize sounds and attach correct spellings.

1.1 USA English vowels

Long vowels are in USA traditional spelling with -e-spoed plurals; spelling USA correct. Note that 'i' has /ɪ/ in most American plurals (i)

The letter "f" spells primarily one sound in US English, the ~f sound. Uniquely, there is one huge exception, the word "of," which is ~uv.

The letter "r"

The letter "r" spells mainly one sound in US English, ~r. The ~r sound affects vowel sounds such that 3 vowels are unique as "r-influenced vowels" (~air, ~er, ~or). It is also often dropped at the end of words.

The letter "s"

The letter "s" spells mainly two sounds. Mainly it spells the ~s sound (46%), but many plurals ending in "s" are pronounced as ~z (37%). About 6% of the time letter "s" is combined with "h" for "sh" the ~sh sound.

The letter "T" spells mainly four sounds and a nonsound. The three main sounds are ~t, ~th, and ~thh. The fourth sound is a ~d swap for the letter "L." The nonsound is a swap of a glottal stop for the ending "t."

The letter "w" is found in text more in combination with other letters than alone.

The letter "y" alone is the only letter that spells a consonant and vowels. It spells a consonant only 19% of the time in running text. Below is a breakdown of vowel spelling frequency.

THE LETTER "Z" IN US ENGLISH

The letter "z" spells only one sound -z. It is the least prevalent letter of the alphabet in text. But the -z sound is of average prevalence since the letter "s" for plurals is often pronounced -z.
