Types

- 1. Plaid checks: It is also known as tartans. Tartan, commonly known as plaid, has vivid, often muted-toned patterns that cross over one another.
- 2. Gingham checks: The Gingham check pattern consists of two or more small, comparable-sized squares, one of which is always white and the other frequently in a red, green, or blue hue.
- 3. Windowpane checks: The narrow stripes that makeup windowpane checked patterns cross each other to create patterns on the glass.
- 4. Shepherds Checks: This design resembles gingham check quite a bit, however, it's often black and white. Sheepskin check is frequently paired with twill cloth.
- 5. Madras checks: The Madras check pattern consists of thick bands of vivid colours crossing one other to create uneven checks.
- 6. Argyle checks: This design, which consists of overlapping diamonds all over a <u>woven</u> <u>fabric</u>, is timeless.
- 7. Pin checks: It is similar to gingham check and in this design, pin-sized broad stripes are crossed very tightly, generating checks that, from a distance, resemble dots.
- 8. Graph checks: It is the most basic type that has a soothing style and texture to it. This is a light fabric with uniformly shaped checks made of narrow bands of a single colour that resemble graph paper.

Style Guide

- Office look: The best way is to tuck in your check shirt (no matter the type) with pants. Make sure you wear a contrasting tie (that's not too loud in colour). And for the footwear, make sure that you select good quality branded handstitched leather shoes for a premium finesse.
- 2. Less formal look: Skip the tie. And keep the outfit as it is. It will make you look smart in no time.
- 3. Evening look: For a cool look, pair your favourite pair of checked shirts with a pair of chinos or washed jeans for a rugged feel and finish.
- 4. Casual Look: Do not tuck in your shirt. The idea is to untuck the shirt but pair it with jeans and a pair of cool sneakers or boots (whichever suits your personality and is comfortable). Another way is to wear an undershirt (this style is cool especially when you're too slim or more muscular) and leave the checked shirt unbuttoned. This is a great way to look charming and yet chic. This style can be sported by both college-going guys as well as by professionals in a laid-back look.
