



# How To Prepare Your Items For Storage

Follow these tips for preserving quality when storing your favorite pieces:



## Small items

Small items can be packed in boxes with packing peanuts and stored in a closet. Small items can be wrapped in newspaper or bubble wrap, then taped shut. Large items should be wrapped with blankets or sheets, then taped shut. They can also be stored in boxes that contain packing peanuts.

## Furniture

- Use furniture pads. This help protect your furnishings from scuff marks and abrasions, as well as keep them in good shape for storage. They're available at most home improvement stores, but consider these three options:
- Padded furniture covers are best suited to soft or upholstered pieces that will be stored away for long periods of time (like couches). They come in many different styles and colors, so you can match your decor while still protecting the item you want to store away! This is one of our favorite ways to keep new furniture looking brand new after being moved into storage—it's so easy! You just remove the cover before tossing it onto the couch or bed frame; then simply replace it when needed again!
- Furniture straps provide another way of protecting delicate surfaces such as wooden floors and rugs by holding them down securely against floorboards/carpeted areas during transit trucks/vans etc., which helps prevent damage from getting worse over time due to lack of carelessness on behalf owner part."

## Bed frames, mattresses, and box springs

In order to prepare your bed frames, mattresses, and box springs for storage, you need to get rid of any bed bugs that may be hiding in the seams or on the mattresses. You can do this by using a mattress bag (a plastic cover that fits over your bed frame), which will keep out pests while providing easy access for cleaning. The best way to protect against infestation is by keeping everything in a sealed plastic container with an airtight sealant around it. If you're worried about someone breaking into your home and stealing things like these items, consider storing them at another location where they won't be so vulnerable—like your garage or attic!

## Appliances

- Appliances:
- Use bubble wrap or other packing material to protect your appliances from damage. Be sure to include any power cords, and pack them separately from the rest of the appliance so they don't get damaged in transit. If you're storing a refrigerator or freezer with ice in it, make sure that you've turned off all electricity before removing anything from your home!
- Don't stack appliances on top of each other; this can cause damage if something falls over during transport (for example, if one of your boxes is too heavy for two boxes stacked together). Also, avoid packing electronics such as televisions and computers in

large cardboard boxes—they may not fit into standard shipping containers without being crumpled up or squashed flat by others' items around them!

## Clothing/Linens

- Use plastic bags to pack your clothing and linens.
- Tie the bag closed with a twist tie or rubber band.
- Use a marker to label the bag with its contents, including the color and size of the item (for example blue jacket, a small).
- Label the box in which your items are stored so that you can easily identify it when unpacking them later on (for example “Jackets”).

## Wrapping furniture and appliances

- Wrap furniture and appliances with blankets, pillows, and moving blankets.
- Use bubble wrap to protect your furniture from breaking due to shifting during transit.
- Move linens in plastic bags instead of boxes—they're easier to pack and less likely to get crushed by the [movers](#) (and there's no need for them to be airtight).
- Don't use newspaper as padding; it can tear easily during packing or unpacking, so don't bother trying this method unless you want an extra headache later on down the line!
