Ju is the youngest son of legendary KBL guard Joo Hui-jeong (Korea University coach). He naturally became acquainted with basketball and was influenced directly or indirectly by his father. Ju Hui-jeong, Ju's father, has triple-double No. 8 in the KBL, ranking first among Korean players and second (No. 1 Albert White).

Joo said, "I naturally became friends with basketball when I was young. I still talk about basketball with my father." He also shared an interesting episode.

Joo Ji-woo said, "I remember watching Samsung games when I was young. One day, my team was losing by one point, but I couldn't do it in a situation where my father could make a layup shot with fast speed." "I'm sorry to my father, but I thought I could do better if I did it, and I started playing basketball," he said with a smile.

Every player's goal is to win. The same goes for Joo Ji-woo from Myongji Middle School, who inherited the desire to win.

"I exercised a lot during the winter training. There is no burden of physical strength," Joo said.

"Our team has various styles of play, but we are a team with good teamwork and teamwork because our strengths are combined. Of course, my goal is to win the championship."

In addition to his outstanding basketball skills, Ju Ji-woo also boasts good looks. He received enough attention outside of basketball.
