

12 points over Taiwan in first match

South Korea, led by head coach Kang Byung-soo, beat Taiwan 75-63 in the first Group A match on the first day of the 2024 FIBA U-18 Women's Asia Cup in Shenzhen, China, on the 24th.

Sixteen countries participated in the tournament, and the top four countries will be eligible to participate in the FIAB U-19 World Cup in 2025. <u>토토사이트넷</u>

South Korea will compete in Group A with Taiwan, Australia and Malaysia.

Choi Ye-seul (Chuncheon Girls' High School) took the lead in the victory with 19 points and 10 rebounds. Song Yoon-ha (Sookmyung Girls' High School) added 12 points and 10 rebounds, and Chung Hyun added 12 points and 8 rebounds.

South Korea will play its second group match against Australia on the 25th.
