Nursing Degree

For example, you must complete the IRON (International Registration for Overseas Nurses) or IRON (International Registration for Overseas Nurses) or IRON (Internationally Qualified Nurses) to work in Australia.

Registration

To work as a registered nurse in another country, you must first obtain a nursing degree and then register with the appropriate agency. For example, to operate as a registered nurse in Australia, one must be registered with the <u>Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Authority</u> (AHPRA).

Language

Since English is the generally accepted official language in most countries, you must pass an English skill test to seek healthcare employment abroad. Some of the recognized tests include the IELTS, TOEFL, etc. This is required to obtain a work visa in your desired nation. However, sometimes, you may also need to be proficient in the native language of a nation to work there. For instance, to work in Germany, you must learn German.

Visa
