Brentford hosted Tottenham at the Brentford Community Stadium in west London on Saturday in an enthralling Premier League encounter.

Brentford started strongly, pressing Tottenham high up the pitch and restricting their opponents to long balls over the top. Brentford's industrious forwards worked tirelessly to hassle Tottenham's centre backs. In the 12th minute, Brentford were rewarded for their enterprising attacking play when Ivan Toney latched onto a lofted pass and finished calmly past Lloris. Tottenham struggled to gain a foothold in the first half. Harry Kane dropped deep in a bid to get on the ball, but Tottenham lacked penetration in the final third. Brentford remained disciplined defensively and restricted Tottenham to just one shot on target in the opening 45 minutes.

In the second half, Antonio Conte switched to a back three and Tottenham began to dominate possession. Kane came more into the game as a result and combined well with Son Heung-Min on the counter. In the 60th minute, Kane nodded down for Son to equalise with a clinical first-time finish .

The goal energised Tottenham and they began to overwhelm Brentford with their superior quality and passing range. In the 85th minute, Brentford's resolve was broken when Sergio Reguilon advanced down the left and centre to combine with Kane, who headed home the winner at the back post. 璽
