COSMETOLOGIST

Cosmetology is a branch of science that studies hair, skin, and nails. Many cosmetologists specialize in one of these areas, while others do hair and nails.

A cosmetologist can also become an esthetician by completing additional training. There are numerous advantages to taking this route, including increased demand and increased business opportunities.

ESTHETICIAN

Esthetics is a branch of medicine that focuses solely on the skin. A licensed esthetician understands skin and how to treat various epidermis conditions. They do not have licenses to color, cut, or treat hair.

Estheticians can specialize in various areas, including permanent makeup, electrolysis, and microdermabrasion.

SIMILARITIES BETWEEN COSMETOLOGISTS AND ESTHETICIANS

Estheticians and cosmetologists deeply understand how to perform popular beauty services in salons and spas. They learn the theory with the practice of a few beauty basics in beauty school, such as hygiene and sterilization practices, as well as anatomy. Also, as maintaining healthy skin, hair, and nails and how to enhance their appearance with various services.

DIFFERENCES BETWEEN COSMETOLOGISTS AND ESTHETICIANS

Licenses in aesthetics and cosmetology enable you to perform specific skills in your beauty career. These two disciplines are distinguished by specifying what they are and where they work. Estheticians are usually in spas, whereas cosmetologists are traditionally in beauty salons. There are some similarities, like, estheticians specialize in skin care services, and cosmetologists offer a wide range of beauty services centered on hair.

You might find a cosmetologist performing services offered by estheticians in a spa, like brow tinting or makeup application, because they both share a foundation in the fundamentals of beauty. For this to occur, they must have specialized training for these services that must be included as part of their license.

However, because estheticians tend to concentrate on the services that are a standard part of a spa visit, like facials, waxing, and makeup application, it is uncommon to find an esthetician who regularly provides services that a cosmetologist performs.
