- Optional: Pooja and Aarathi: For a more immersive experience, you can participate in a puja (worship ceremony) conducted by a temple priest, followed by the mesmerizing aarathi (offering of light) ritual.

Tips:

• Dress modestly, covering your shoulders and knees. Men are required to remove shirts before entering the sanctum sanctorum.

- Shoes are not allowed inside the temple complex. Carry a small bag to store them while exploring.
- Photography is generally not permitted within the temple's inner sanctum.

Morning (9:00 AM - 11:00 AM): Parthasarathy Temple

Following the blessings at Kapaleeshwarar Temple, we head to the Parthasarathy Temple, another architectural marvel dedicated to Lord Vishnu. Located in Triplicane, this vibrant temple is believed to have been built during the Pallavas dynasty (3rd - 8th century AD).

What to Expect:

- Abode of Five Pandavas: Dedicated to the five Pandava brothers from the epic Mahabharata, the temple is adorned with intricate carvings depicting scenes from the epic tale.
- Exquisite Sculptures and Paintings: Marvel at the exquisite sculptures and wall paintings that narrate stories from Hindu mythology, showcasing the artistic excellence of the bygone era.
- Peaceful Ambience: The temple complex offers a sense of tranquility amidst the bustling city, providing a space for reflection and introspection.
- Optional: Offering of Flowers and Sweets: Participate in the traditional offering of flowers and sweets to the deities for a truly enriching experience.

Tips:

- Similar dress code restrictions apply as at Kapaleeshwarar Temple.
- Photography is permitted in the outer courtyard but not within the sanctum sanctorum.
- Consider purchasing prasadam (blessed food) offered by the temple as a memento of your visit.

Mid-Morning (11:00 AM - 1:00 PM): Break for Lunch and Local Delicacies

After seeking blessings at the two prominent temples, take a well-deserved break for lunch. Chennai offers a delectable array of vegetarian and non-vegetarian South Indian cuisine. Indulge in a traditional South Indian thali (a platter with a variety of dishes) at a local vegetarian restaurant like Saravana Bhavan or try the legendary filter coffee.

Optional (1:00 PM - 2:00 PM): Kalakshetra - A Cultural Interlude

If time permits, consider a detour to the Kalakshetra, a renowned institution dedicated to preserving and promoting classical Indian dance forms like Bharatanatyam. Witness a rehearsal or a performance (subject to availability) to experience the grace and elegance of these ancient traditions.

Afternoon (2:00 PM - 4:00 PM): Santhome Basilica

The afternoon leg of our temple tour takes us to the Santhome Basilica, a magnificent Catholic church dedicated to St. Thomas, one of the twelve apostles of Jesus Christ. Built in the 16th century, the basilica stands as a testament to the city's rich religious tapestry.

- Photography is generally permitted in the outer courtyard but not within the sanctum sanctorum.

Evening (5:30 PM - 6:30 PM): Witnessing the Evening Arati at Kapaleeshwarar Temple

Witness the temple illuminated by flickering diyas (oil lamps) as priests offer prayers and light offerings to the deities.
