Independent School Fees in the UK

Tuition fees at UK independent schools vary widely, ranging from approximately £3,600 to £57,690 per year. Several factors influence the cost, including:

- **Academic stage:** Fees generally increase as students move up through the school years.
- **Reputation:** Schools with higher academic rankings tend to charge more due to demand.
- **Extracurricular activities:** A rich programme of clubs, sports, and arts may increase fees.
- **Location:** Schools in high-demand or affluent areas usually charge higher tuition.

Boarding Options at UK Independent Schools

While many UK independent schools offer boarding, not all do. It's estimated that around one-third provide some form of boarding accommodation. The types of boarding available include:

- **Full-time boarding**
- **Weekly boarding**
- **Flexi-boarding (a few days per week)**

Some schools offer accommodation similar to bed and breakfast for part-time boarders. Note that boarding is generally not available for children under the age of 7.
