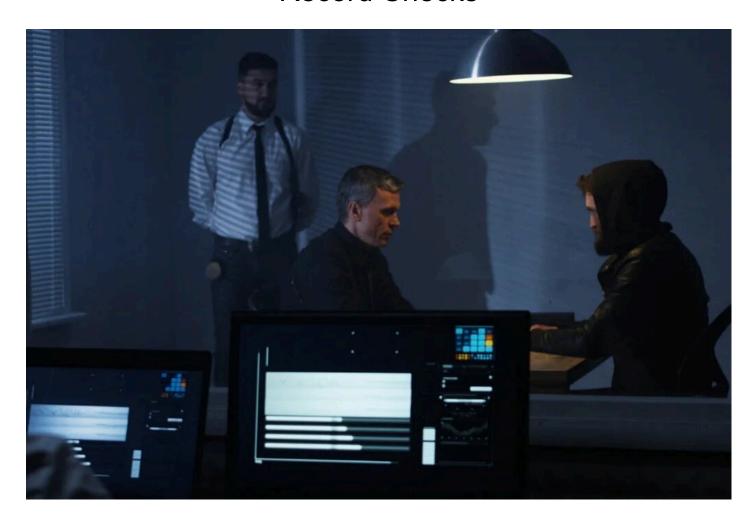


CCRTIS-SCICTR - What It Is and Its Role in Criminal Record Checks
